SKIPPER OF THE MONTH

Paul Kaplan, Captain of **Santana**

It's not often that one gets to own a piece of genuine Hollywood history. The original Maltese Falcon statue, Judy Garland's "ruby slippers" from The Wizard of Oz and John Travolta's white disco suit from Saturday Night Fever have all fetched top dollar at auction. You can add to this list Humphrey Bogart's beloved sailing yacht "Santana," now the proud possession of new WHYC members Paul and Christine Kaplan.

"'Santana' has gone through 13 owners since she was built in 1935, but by far her most famous owners were Humphrey Bogart and Lauren Bacall who owned her between 1945 and 1957," Paul said. "This boat was his passion. He sailed her average 35 to 45 weekends a year. He kept a model of the boat in a glass case along with his two Academy Awards. This same model sat by the pulpit

during his funeral. Our family serves as 'Santana's' current custodian, but it will always be 'Bogie's boat.'"

Paul, a lifelong sailor, acquired "Santana" in 1998 following its tragic sinking in her Bay Area berth a year earlier. Twin brothers owned the boat; one passed away and the surviving brother found it too large a task to repair her and reluctantly opted to sell the yacht instead.

"I own my own boat yard - Keefe

Kaplan Maritime, Inc. – so I had the means to repair her myself," Kaplan explained. "I'd been the victim of other boat yards in the past. This time, I figured I could be a victim of my own!"

Originally built as a schooner, the boat had been transformed into a yawl early in her life. Paul made it his mission to return "Santana" to her original configuration. "We invested about 15,000 hours in restoration and repairs over the course of a year. The results were more than worth it."

Although he and his wife Christine live in San Francisco, they decided to bring "Santana" back to her birthplace in Southern California for several races, including the recent One More Time Regatta. Both avid sailors, the Kaplan's intend to race "Santana" in this year's Newport-Ensenada Race as well. As for any long-distance adventures...?

"Santana" has already sailed around the world. Now 70 years old, I think she deserves to spend her golden years relaxing in her home waters," said Paul.
