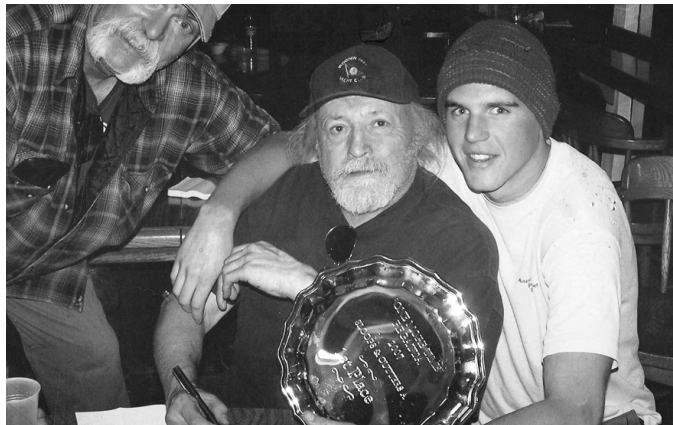

## 30<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL MCNISH CLASSIC YACHT RACE

Ventura resident Don Greene, skippering his 40-foot "**Elusive II**," won the Strathmore Cup in the 30th running of the **McNish Classic Yacht Race** (NCYR) on Saturday, August 4th, 2007. C.F. Koehler of San Diego earned Best Elapsed Time honors for his deft handling of the 59-foot "**Sally**," a 1928 10-meter sloop. The event is sponsored by the Pacific Corinthian Yacht Club.

Of the 30 boats entered, 29 started and 23 finished the 17-mile course.

Back after nearly a 20-year absence to win first place in the Schooner class was Byron Chamberlain's 51-foot "**Rose of Sharon**," a 1930 beauty that also earned the Bristol Boat Award. "**Dauntless**," skippered by San Diegan Paul Plotts, took second.

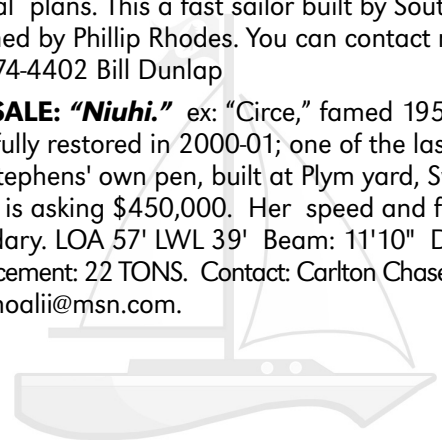

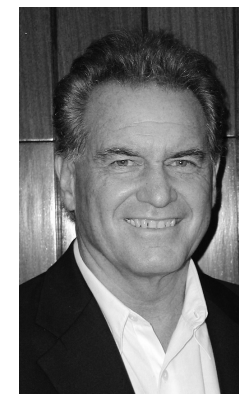
